IRI Update

November 13, 2007

Forty Niner Members:

As many of you know, IRI Golf Group has been attempting to obtain permits to construct a new restaurant adjacent to the pavilion and replace the cart storage building that was destroyed by fire.

This process has been extremely long and frustrating. It seems nothing was ever permitted properly back in the early 1960's and the building codes have changed multiple times. After spending hundreds of hours obtaining aerial photographs and tax records to prove what was in place during various dates, and walking through the confusing process of gaining County approval, we hit our final road block. Pima County wanted us to spend over \$200,000 on improvements to the parking lot before anything new could be constructed.

So, in lieu of spending over \$200,000 on just the parking lot, we decided to spend the money more efficiently. We re-carpeted and re-painted the clubhouse, separated the fitness area with a permanent wall, expanded the restaurant into the seldom used men's locker room, created a new entrance directly into the restaurant, installed new kitchen equipment, added new flat screen televisions, and re-stuccoed the wall by the pool.

We have a meeting Thursday with the insurance company regarding the cart storage building in hopes of beginning that structure very soon.

We finally gained approval from Pima County to turn the old lake on #6 into a waste bunker. This work should begin within the next two weeks.

With the reopening of the clubhouse, we would like to announce the arrival of our new Food & Beverage Manager Todd Gadow. Todd has had a very successful career in food & beverage and wanted to make a moveback to the golf industry.

Beginning January 1, 2008, we will be reinstating the food & beverage minimums of \$120 per quarter for full golf members, \$90 per quarter for full golf Singlemembers and \$60 per quarter for Golf & Fitness members.

We apologize for any inconveniences this transition may have caused, but are confident you will be pleased with the new building configuration and restaurant.
